Participant COVID PROTOCOLS

College Park United Methodist Church is monitoring the current situation and putting safety procedures into place that will best keep our participants and staff safe. Currently, VBS enrollment numbers are limited to allow maximum social distancing amongst groups. If circumstances change during the coming months, we may open more spaces as it becomes safe to do so. All VBS participants and staff will be required to wear a mask during camp. SAFETY MEASURES:

Face masks required for all participants; no exceptions.

Staff and Volunteers will ensure proper handwashing and good hand hygiene, respiratory etiquette, and follow a strict sick child/staff policy.

Individual and spaced-out activities to practice safe physical distancing to the best of our ability.

Significant disinfecting of supplies and activity areas throughout the day.

Staff and Volunteers will limit the amount of shared supplies and equipment for activities by providing each participant their own for the duration of camp, when feasible.

FOOD AND DRINK

We will provide one snack during the day in an individually packaged portion. Each child must bring their own water bottle with their name on it. If you would prefer your child to bring their own snack please pack it and bring each day.

CHECK-IN PROCEDURES

Check-in will include a daily temperature check for children prior to entry. Children who have a temperature of more than 100°F will not be allowed to stay.

On the first day of camp parents/guardians will be asked if their camper has recently been in close contact with a person who has been diagnosed with, tested for, or quarantined as a result of COVID-19. There is a COVID waiver to sign on the first day of VBS.

Parents, guardians, and other non-essential visitors will not be permitted into VBS areas other than the Sanctuary.

Parents/guardians are encouraged to designate one person to drop off campers every day. Individuals who are at higher risk for severe illness per CDC guidelines should not drop off or pick up campers.

PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Parents/guardians are required to provide a valid driver's license each day for pick-up.

Parents, guardians, and other non-essential visitors will not be permitted into designated VBS areas other than the Sanctuary.

Parents/guardians are encouraged to designate one person to pick up campers every day. Individuals who are at higher risk for severe illness per CDC guidelines should not drop off or pick up children.
